

90-minute thrill ride with music spanning the last half of the twentieth century, as well as new tunes written by David and performed by the largest big-band orchestra in Las Vegas.

After a 15 year absence, he then returned to concert stages across the country and the world. "I've never gone out and changed my style to suit the times. I have always stayed true to myself by trying to sing and write about the human experience." That honesty is naturally compelling and, in general, it's what people want to see. Bringing that human element to my work is the most important thing I can do as both a producer and an entertainer."

Off stage, David is equally committed. He and his wife, songwriter Sue Shifrin-Cassidy, were instrumental in the 1994 Rebuild LA campaign, composing the effort's anthem, "Stand and Be Proud." Their song "Message to the World" was donated to help the children in Kosovo, and led to Sue's formation of KidsCharities.org, in which David played a very active role. David and Sue have a 14 year old son, Beau.

As if that weren't enough, David breeds and races thoroughbred horses, a passion he has had since his youth.
