



UP to NOW . . .

Immediately after David Cassidy's stage debut on Broadway in "Fig Leaves Are Falling," he returned to Hollywood, a bit discouraged at the show's closing, but determined not to give up his goal. David's manager, Ruth Aarons, believed strongly in his talents and brought him to the attention of producers who cast him in various television shows. One of these, a segment of "Marcus Welby, M.D." gave David his best part up to then, and the audience reaction was tremendous. It was apparent that David Cassidy had star quality.

David was soon cast in a pilot for a proposed TV series called "The Partridge Family." The show debuted on ABC-TV in September of 1970 and proved at once to be a major hit.

David's first recording, "I Think I Love You," was released in the fall of 1970 and sold over three million records. This was just the beginning. Every Partridge album and single record since has sold into the millions.

David Cassidy gave his first live concert in March of 1971, and now has continued his amazing career strides by releasing his first solo album, "Cherish."
