

David's goals in life...



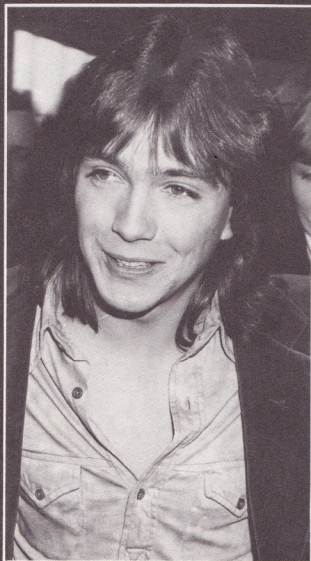
