Ian Anderson has proven that a mysterious, mythical friend of his does really exist.

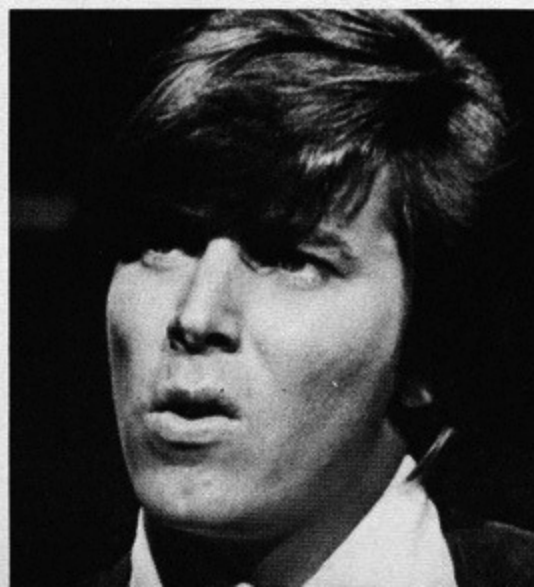
