Understanding is a quality David expects and needs most of all from a girl. He realizes that at this stage in his career, he not only

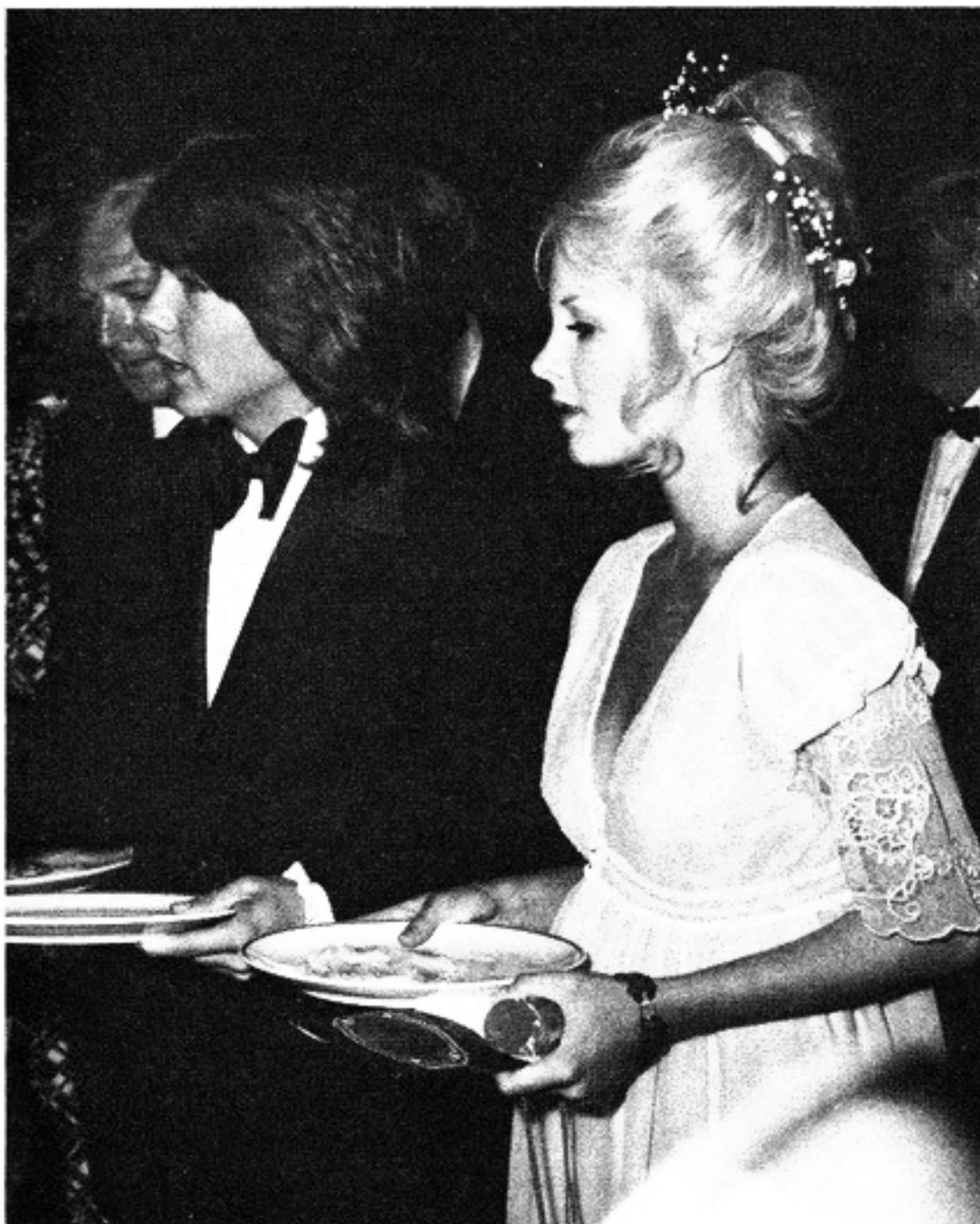

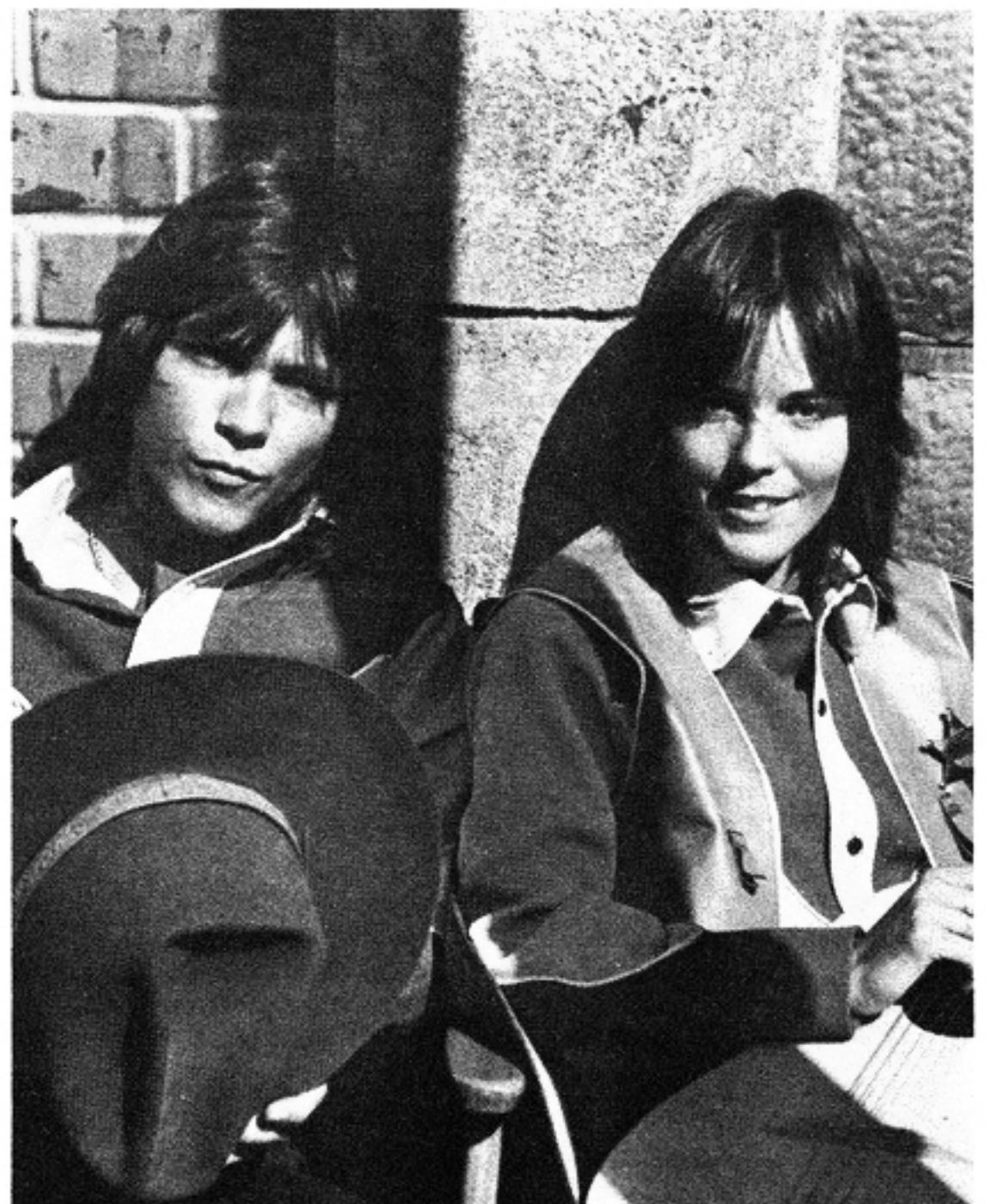
