• SWINGING SOUNDS:

Black Sabbath: "VOL. 4" is a real dynamite album! All fans of Sabbath will enjoy listening to this sound especially "Wheels of Confusion" and "Changes" on the first side and "Laguna Sunrise" on the second! There's also some great action shots captured on the inside in color photography taken of the Black Sabbath on stage!

Cat Stevens: "CATCH BULL AT FOUR" is an album that should be a definite yes on your list! Cat composed all the tunes but one and the album's got the lyrics for you too! One of our favorite selections is "The Boy With the Moon and Star On His Head!" The last line goes "I'll tell you everything I've learned and Love is all... he said."



Blood, Sweat & Tears: "NEW BLOOD." All fans of the BS&T will love their latest release. There are only 9 cuts on the LP but they're 9 good ones including one written by Bob Dylan, "Down in the Flood" and one by Carole King, "Snow Queen." BS&T can look for another big seller!



Melanie: "STONEGROUND WORDS" is another picture-lyric album you'll really go for. If you loved Melanie's hit single "Roller Skate" this is an album for you. Melanie composed all songs but one and even dedicated one called "Here I Am" to her mother. She plays the guitar too, and you can sing along.



Delaney & Bonnie: "THE BEST OF DELANEY & BONNIE" is just that—the best. It includes "Only You Know And I Know" and "Free the People" and an added attraction: Leon Russell on guitar and piano, and the voices of Eric Clapton and Rita Coolidge! This is sure to be a number one selling album to add to your collection!

Gordon Lightfoot: "OLD DAN'S RECORDS." Once again we've got an album filled with songs written by the singer! Gordon's composed 10 beautiful tunes you'll definitely want to get familiar with!



Jimmy Osmond: "KILLER JOE!" Well, little Jimmy O has done it again. If you heard his single "Long Haired Lover from Liverpool," then you know what to expect. Little Jimbo's very first LP includes songs like "Killer Joe" and "My Girl!" Jimmy does a super job on his first album and Tiger Beat's own photographer Kenny Lieu shot the picture on the back cover of the LP!



Wayne Newton: "CAN'T YOU HEAR THE SONG?" All Wayne Newton fans will go for this one! It's produced by "Partridge" record producer Wes Farrell so you know it's got to be good! Some of the selections done beautifully by Wayne are "Song Sung Blue," "Alone Again, Naturally" and "All Alone Am I."

David Cassidy: "ROCK ME BABY." You might think that David's 2nd LP will sound like his single "Rock Me Baby," but it doesn't! The other selections are mostly soft, slow ballads that David handles very well. Some of the tunes on the album have been composed by Kim Carnes and Dave Ellingson (the back-up singers who perform with David at his concerts) and David's written one himself, "Two Time Loser." David's second LP is perfect for curling up on a rainy night, closing your eyes and dreaming that David's right there beside you!

• SINGLES OF THE MONTH:

Shirley Jones: "AIN'T LOVE EASY" is a record must for all "Partridge Family" fans. You might recognize Shirley's single as a song she sung on one of the "Partridge" shows not long ago! You'll definitely want to add this to your "Partridge" record collection. Shirley's got a sure hit!

Starship: "JOHNNY B. GOODE." This single release is an old song by Chuck Berry (My Ding-A-Ling) redone by a new group! Not so new though, because the members are ex-Monkee Micky Dolenz and Michael Lloyd who is co-producer along with Alan of all the Osmond records! It's a fast, lively tune that should move right up the chart! Add it to your singles' set!

• MOVIES OF THE MONTH:

"SNOWBALL EXPRESS" (Walt Disney Productions). As usual, Walt Disney Productions have put out an excellent movie for the whole family! "Snowball Express" stars Dean Jones, Nancy Olson, Harry Morgan and Johnny Whitaker. The story is about a New York businessman who inherits a beat-up hotel in the Rocky Mountains. He opens it as a resort and, having no money, has to use his children (Johnny and Kathleen Cody) to work there. Luckily, the family already has a St. Bernard named Stoutheart!

The entire movie is filled with mishaps and fun...there's one hilarious skiing scene in which the father tries to prove that he can ski—which he can't. The story of how this family gets the money to open and improve the resort is really heart-warming and funny.

The scenery is just beautiful—it was filmed at Crested Butte, Colo., in sometimes 36-degree below weather! This is one movie that's really worth seeing—just in time for Christmas!
