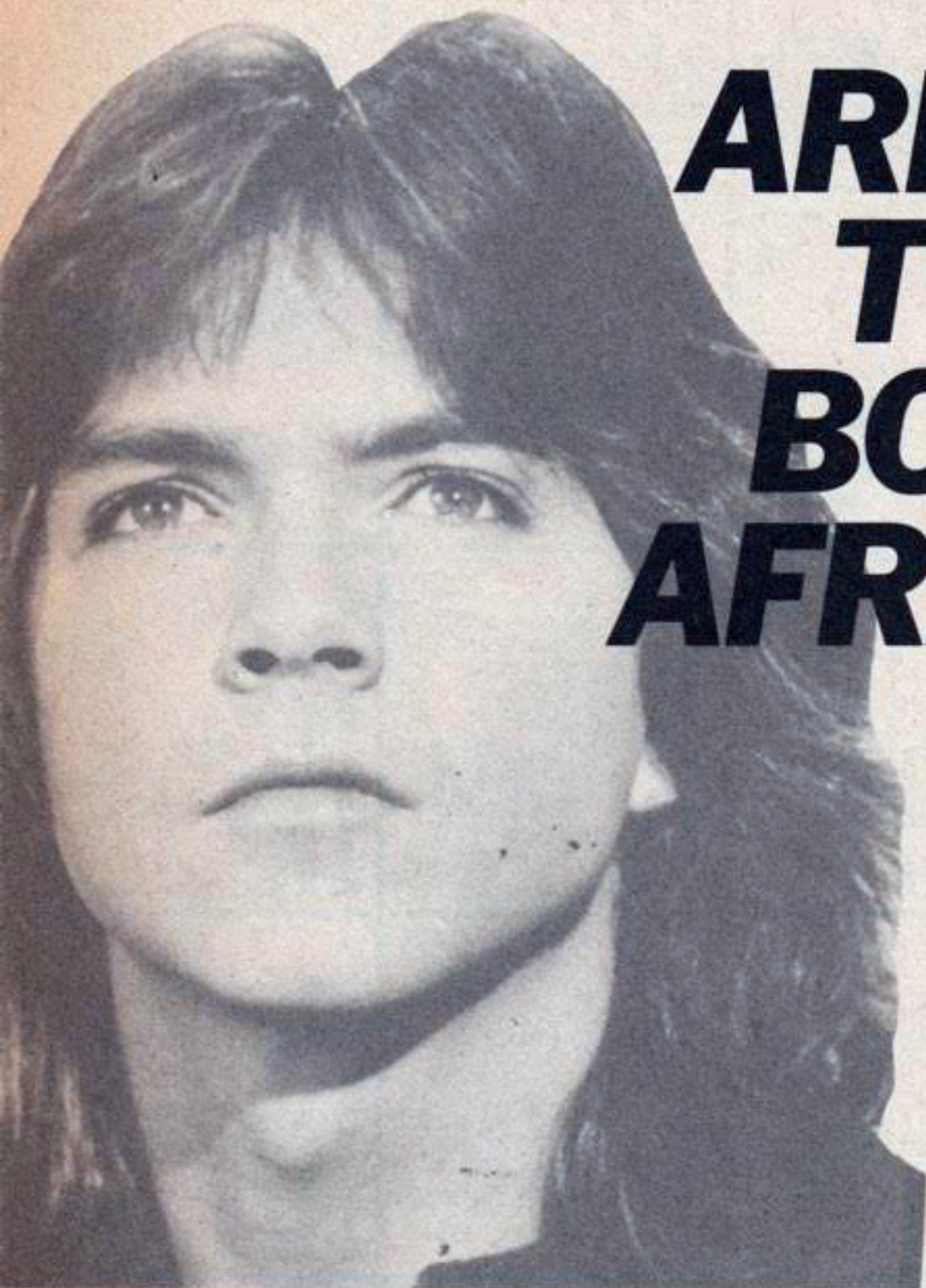


DAVID AND DONNY:
