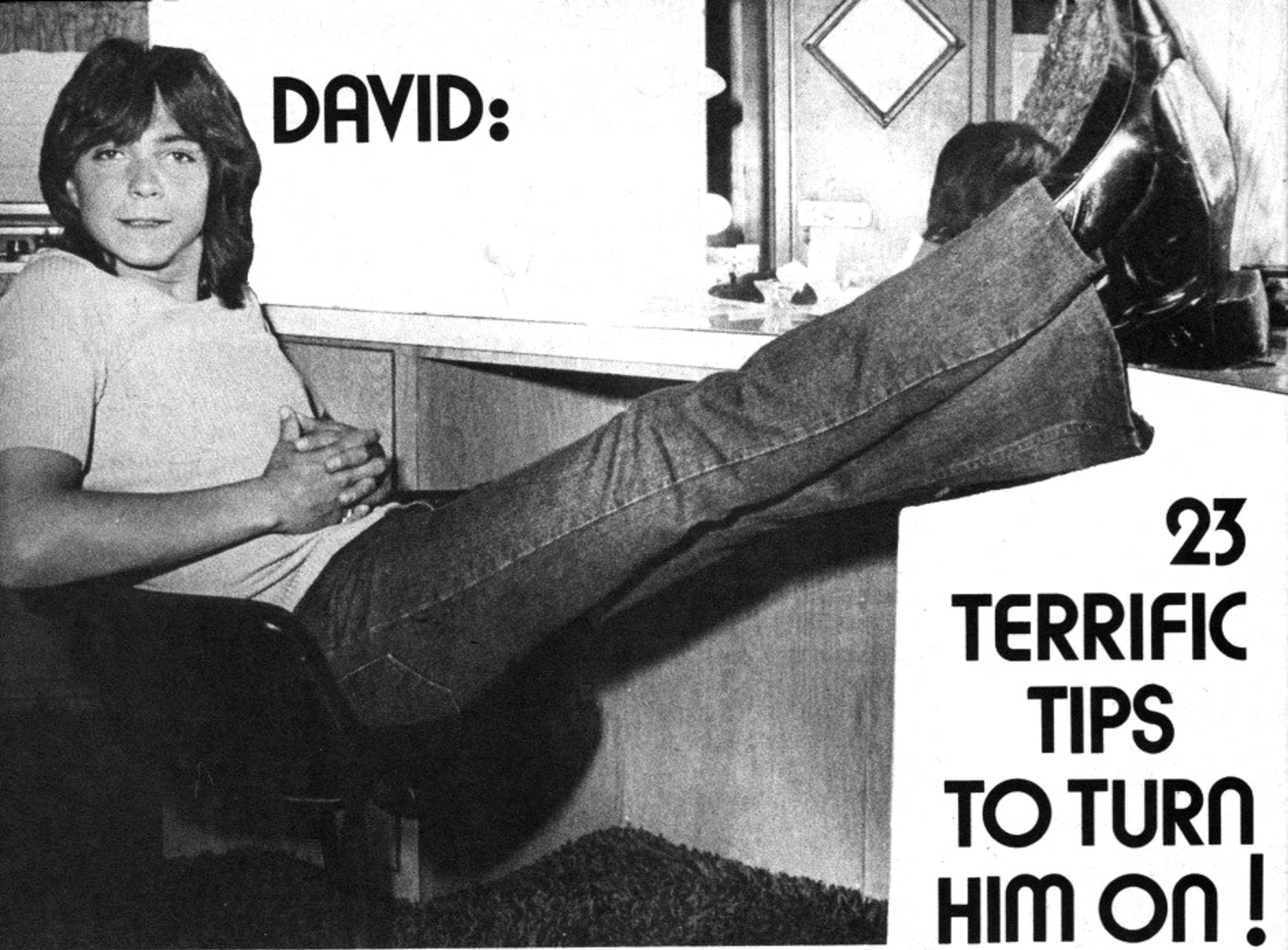

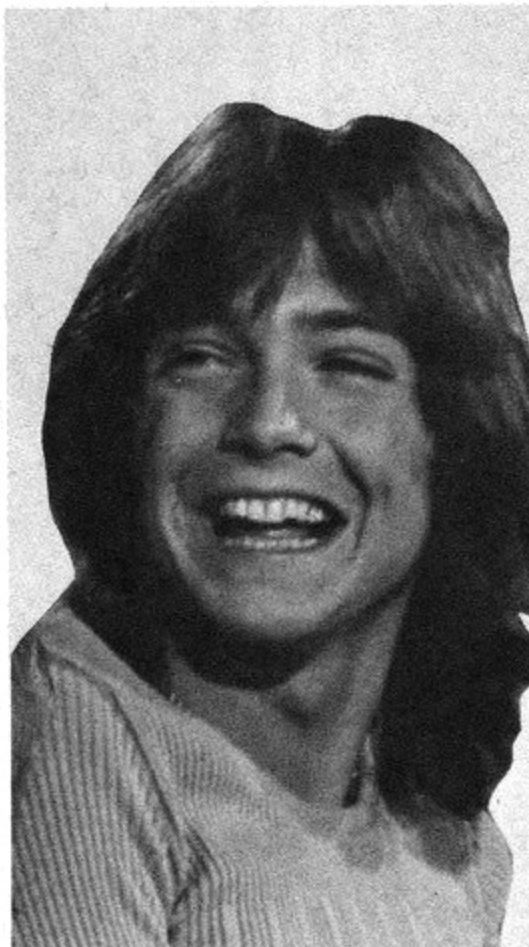


23 TERRIFIC TIPS TO TURN HIM ON!
