

Career highlights

»In 1969, Cassidy made his professional debut in the Broadway musical "The Fig Leaves are Falling." He signed with Universal Studios that same year and appeared in episodes of several TV series, including "Ironside," "Marcus Welby, M.D.," "Adam-12" and "Bonanza."

»He landed the role of Keith Partridge on the TV sitcom "The Partridge Family" in 1970. That same year, the Partridge Family song "I Think I Love You" hit No. 1 on the Billboard Pop Singles chart.

»Cassidy covered the Association's 1966 song "Cherish" on his 1972 album of the same name. His version reached No. 9 on the Hot 100 chart and spent one week at No. 1 on the Adult Contemporary chart.

»He starred in Broadway productions of "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" and "Blood Brothers." He also appeared in London's West End production of the musical "Time."

»In 1978, Cassidy starred in an episode of "Police Story" titled "A Chance To Live." He earned an Emmy nomination for the role.

»He has produced and performed in several Las Vegas stage shows, including "EFX," "The Rat Pack Is Back" and "At the Copa."

»His 2002 album, "Then and Now," returned Cassidy to the Top 5 of the UK album charts for the first time since 1974.

»He co-starred alongside half-brother Patrick Cassidy in the short-lived 2009 ABC Family comedy series "Ruby & the Rockits," which was created by his half-brother Shaun.
