PRIOR TO joining the Partridge clan, Cassidy appeared in summer stock, won a co-starring role in Broadway's "The Leaves Are Falling," and had leading roles in TV's "Ironside," "Marcus Welby," "Adam 12," "FBI" and "Bonanza."
