

Tickets on sale for Cassidy show

Tickets are now on sale at all Joske's stores for the David Cassidy concert appearance on Friday evening, March 3, at HemisFair Arena. The 8 p.m. show, sponsored by Joske's of Texas is produced by Southwest Concerts.

All seats are reserved, priced at \$3.50, \$4.50 and \$5.50, and may be charged to Joske's accounts. Persons wishing to order tickets by mail should address their order to Joske's Ticket Service, P.O. Box 961, San Antonio 78203. All mail orders should include a self-addressed, stamped envelope and 25 cents to cover handling. The Joske's charge number must be included on charge orders, with checks or money orders made payable to Joske's Ticket Service.

David Cassidy was literally discovered by the younger generation after a few appearances playing feature roles on "Marcus

Welby", "Ironside", "Bonanza" and others during the 1969-70 TV season. Soon after his episodes aired, stations and networks were barraged with fan mail for Cassidy.

His father is the actor Jack Cassidy and his step-mother is the lovely Shirley Jones, with whom he co-stars in ABC-TV's "The Partridge Family", which debuted in September, 1970. In the show, David is able to combine acting with another love — music. In the role of Keith Partridge, he is lead singer and plays the guitar in the family's musical group. Off-screen, David, a natural musician, also plays the drums and guitar.

His first single for Bell Records, "I Think I Love You", released before the debut of "The Partridge Family" series, sold 3.5 million copies, followed soon by the first "Partridge Family" album which sold over one million copies.

His second single, "Doesn't Somebody Want To Be Wanted", topped the million sales mark four weeks after being released. The second album, "Up to Date", sold over one million copies in three weeks.
