

# David Cassidy, Nashville Group Signed For Expohio '72 Concerts

FINDLAY — Details of Expohio '72, this year's Ohio State Fair, were unfolded at the Imperial House here Wednesday evening for newsmen from northwestern Ohio.

The fair's new manager, Victor Lucas, announced contracts have recently been signed with rock singer David Cassidy and Nashville performers Chet Atkins, Floyd Cramer and Boots

Randolph to appear in this year's free grandstand shows.

Fair officials already had announced comedian Bob Hope, the Osmonds, Kenny Rogers and the First Edition will appear in grandstand shows during the 12-day fair which will begin in Columbus Aug. 24 and continue through Sept. 4.

Cassidy, star of the television show "The Partridge Family,"

will appear Labor Day, Sept. 4, for two shows.

Atkins on the guitar, Cramer the piano and Randolph the saxophone, will present pop, rock, contemporary, folk and country music selections for two performances on Sunday, Aug. 27. Also known as the "Festival of Music" show, its entourage includes the "Music City Sound of Strings" and the "Boots Randolph Orchestra."

Lucas said an anticipated 2.5 million fairgoers are expected at this year's state fair, known as the All American Fair. Last year approximately 2.2 million people attended the fair.

During the press conference and dinner meeting, it was stressed the Ohio State Fair has the "world's largest" horse show, livestock exhibition and junior fair.
