

Cassidy to Appear At Eden Park

Harry Miller has chosen the Eden Park, Auckland, as the venue for the David Cassidy concert on February 6.

The massive park was chosen because Miller is expecting about 15,000 to hear their idol.

Cassidy will perform from a special stage where one set of goal posts normally stands, so everyone will have the chance to see his gyrations.

Auckland is Cassidy's only New Zealand venue, and has been chosen as the starting-point of his world tour. From Auckland he will head to Australia, where he will work five shows.

"Hard Work?"

Apparently, his managers, or possibly Cassidy himself, think the one and a-half hour performances he gives are

pretty hard work, so his six Australasian gigs have been spread throughout six weeks.

Cassidy will be travelling with 19 people, including rock group and brass section, and apparently there are no plans at this stage for a supporting act.

The price of the tickets will be \$4.10, so anyone who wishes to spend this sum will see one and a-half hours straight. Cassidy will probably be able to afford to.

To cater for the sea-weenies expected to attend the concert will start at 7 p.m. The large majority of his fans are reportedly aged from eight years on.
