



His job is to keep Cassidy happy

THE man who will look after teenyboppers' heart-throb **DAVID CASSIDY** in New Zealand and Australia, is ex-Aucklander **SIMON DICKIE** (22), who has worked for the Harry Miller organization ever since he left King's College four years ago.

Dickie's most recent job for Miller has been to take the Russian film version of "Swan Lake" through Australia. The film, which features the Kirov Ballet Company, may come here.

Dickie now lives in Melbourne, as do his parents, ex-Remuera GPs **JOHN** and **CHRISTABELL**, who shifted there nearly two years ago, and live in the Dandenongs. John Dickie is in practice full time, his wife part time.

Also in Australia is Dickie's sister **SUSAN** (Susan Cumming, wife of educationist **ALAN CUMMING**). She and her husband both have doctorates. He lectures full time at Townsville University, she part-time. Another brother **JOHN**, has also shifted to Melbourne where he is a pollution engineer.

Simon Dickie, a constant visitor here, was the first to suggest approaching Eden Park Trust Board to hire the park for the Cassidy concert. It will be an all-ticket affair—15,000 tickets at \$4 each—with the audience in stands numbers five, six and seven.

Dickie comments: Since we announced the concert the phone has run hot with Auckland girls wanting to know details.

Cassidy is likely to arrive here on February 25, the day before the concert.
