

DAVID CASSIDY— MAN UNDERCOVER



Craig Stevens and Ty Hardin—television stars since the late 1950s—will guest-star with 1970s TV personality David Cassidy (pictured) in 'Baby Makes Three,' a segment of NBC-TV's new action-drama series 'David Cassidy—Man Undercover,' which premieres Thursday, Nov. 2.

Stevens, who starred in the title role of the popular 'Peter Gunn' detective series, portrays an affluent lawyer who masterminds a black market baby ring that contracts destitute college students to breed infants for sale to childless parents.

Hardin, who plays Stevens' main henchman, starred in the western series 'Cheyenne' as Bronco Layne and co-starred in the feature film 'PT-109.'

Cassidy stars as Officer Dan Shay, who poses as a student contractee to bust the operation. Simon Oakland and Wendy Rastatter co-star as Sergeant Abrams and Joanne Shay.

Vince Edwards, director of 'Baby Makes Three,' co-starred with Cassidy as Sergeant Abrams in the 'Police Story' drama that was the series' pilot.
