Partridge travails oddly entertaining

They wore garish crushed velvet costumes. Drove around in a funky psychedelic school bus and sang drippy pop songs

that carried as much weight as a paper clip.

Nevertheless, when The Partridge Family aired on ABC from 1970 to 1974, it was a bona fide hit. And long-haired lead singer David Cassidy was a bona fide pop icon who had a bigger fan club than Elvis and the Beatles . . . combined. OK, cue the dramatic music.

But when the cameras stopped rolling and the cheering subsided, the actors who played the Partridges were forced to cope with instant fame, depression and domestic abuse.

OK, stop the music.

Come on Get Happy: The Partridge Family Story, is a surprise ingly poignant and often funny look at what it was really like

to be in one of America's most famous TV families. The story is told through the eyes of Danny Bonaduce (Shawn Pyfrom), that "40-year-old midget in a kid's suit," as one TV producer called him. Bonaduce, who narrates the film, may have lived in a squeaky-clean family on TV, but his real home life was anything but squeaky-clean. He was often physically abused by his dad (Boy Meets World's William Russ), who was jealous of his son's fame. If that wasn't enough, the

freckle-faced Bonaduce — are you ready for this, America? – smoked, checked out co-star Susan Dey (Kathy Wagner) undressing and loved *Playboy*.

We all know Cassidy's deal. He hated playing goodygoody teen idol Keith Partridge. After all, the guy was a 20year-old free spirit who wanted to play rock 'n' roll. When the show's producers were miffed at Cassidy (a convincing Rodney Scott) for showing too much skin on a magazine cover, Cassidy shouts back, "I have a life . . . and pubic hair!"

While Come on Get Happy is based on a true story, the producers take some dramatic license. The funniest is a fictitious high noon-like exchange between Danny Partridge and Bob-

by Brady of The Brady Bunch on a studio soundstage.

Danny: Hey, Brady. Wanna fight? Bobby: Anyplace, any time, Freckles.

Danny: Oh, yeah? My family is better than your family!

Bobby: Is not!

Danny: We still get higher ratings.

Bobby: That's not true, your ratings suck!

Any movie that shows the ugly side of Danny Partridge and Bobby Brady is worth watching. You'll also see Florence Henderson and Shirley Jones get into their own hissy fit.

ABC was wise to hire actors who look like Partridge Family clones. Eve Gordon is particularly uncanny in her resemblance to Jones. The actors also rise above the corny '70s kitsch with moving performances. As the pigeonholed Cassidy and the abused Bonaduce, Scott and Pyfrom are especially effective.

And Come on Get Happy is an effective TV movie.
