On Sunday, May 26th, David plays White City Stadium in London. Again, the doors open at 6.00 p.m. and the gig starts at 8.00 p.m. The tickets are all £2.20 each. To get your ticket, send an S.A.E. and a cheque or postal order for the correct amount to David Cassidy Tickets, White City Stadium, London, W.12. Oh, and make sure that the cheque or postal order is made payable to MEL BUSH ORGANISATION, LTD.

Ticket agencies won't have tickets for the concerts for another month or so yet, so don't be fooled by any that advertise tickets for sale: no valid tickets can be sold more than a month in advance except those sold by the people at White City. Kim and Dave will be on the tour as well, and so will Gloria and Trish (the two girls who were 'accused' of being David's fiancée last year). It really looks like a super tour: David will be playing everything from drums to piano!

Oh, and yet another bit of hope for fans in the North and Ireland. Keep your fingers crossed: David is trying to arrange a gig somewhere in the North, in Ireland, and/or possibly in Wales.

And that's not all the good news either! On May 3rd, David will be releasing a new single on the Bell label. The "A" side is entitled "If I Didn't Care", and it dates from the early 1930's. But don't think for a moment that David is becoming an old man! Far from it: he really digs the song, and to bring it up to date, he produced it himself.

I heard it (thanks to the good folk at Bell) and I can assure you that it's one of David's greatest songs yet. The "B" side is called "Frozen Noses", and it deals with two people who meet on a snowy day.
