So many of you have been writing to ask when David's live album will be released that I guess this must be tops on the list of most important questions.

Now, without further ado, let's get down to the facts about David's exciting new releases. At the time of writing, I'm not really sure whether the good folks at Bell will be able to release David's single and album on schedule or not, but at any rate, you should be able to get them both by the middle of this month.

The single will include two of David's all time rock and roll faves, "Please Please Me" on the A side, and "C.C. Rider" on the B side.

The album, entitled DAVID CASSIDY LIVE! includes the two tracks from the single, as well as "Breaking Up Is Hard To Do", "Daydreamer", "How Can I Be Sure", "What In The World", "Preying On My Mind", "Some Kind Of A Summer", "Mae", "I Am A Clown", and a medley of rock and roll songs which I know you'll remember if you went to the concert. They include bits of "Blue Suede Shoes", "Rock Around The Clock", "Jail House Rock", "Rock And Roll Music", and, of course, David's own contribution, "Rock Me Baby".

This is really a double first for David: not only is it the first album he's produced himself, it's also the first (and let's hope not the last) time he's recorded here.
