"It's funny, really, to have watched David come from a promising beginner to a superstar in a matter of a few years.

"And it's even funnier when you realise that David hasn't changed at all in so many ways.

"I don't mean that he hasn't grown as a person or as a professional," Susan was quick to point out. "What I mean is that, even though he's at the top of the entertainment world. David still hasn't changed in his relationships to other people. He's still the same friendly, considerate ouv.

"For instance," Susan continued, "when David and all of us were working frantically to finish The Partridge Family series, things got pretty tense.

"The scriptwriters had been unusual if the person you're on strike, and we were hopelessly behind schedule. And nobody was more anxious to get things finished than David.

"It was his last season, and he was naturally eager to get on with what he wanted to do.

"But I can't remember a time when David was anything but pleasant, co-operative and helpful. Every time things looked like disaster, David would always be calm and cheerful.

"It really helped ease the situation, too, 'cos I know sometimes when I wanted to scream. David would somehow notice it and come around and chat for a minute.

"He just never managed to get one of those massive egos that some people develop, I can't remember a time when David ever used his star status to get what he wanted.

"That's pretty rare in the entertainment world, and I'm really glad that I got a chance to meet David, and work with him."

Jan Freeman is a name you'll probably remember. She served as David's stand-in on The Partridge Family, and left before his last season to go to college.

A stand-in's job is one of the most thankless in Hollywood. It requires standing under blazing hot lights for long periods of time, with people coming up and sticking light meters, tape rules and all kinds of things under your nose.

After long, motionless minutes, some one then tells you to get lost! Then the star comes in, and the acting begins. The only time anyone says anything to you is when you've goofed. And it's standing in for even knows

your name. Happily for Jan Freeman, this was far from the case with David. She told me "I remember my first day on the set. when the show began, I was really scared. After all, not only had I heard that stand-ins were the lowest form of life. I was sure that David would resent the fact that his stand-in

"So you can imagine how surprised I was when David walked up and said 'Hello, I hear you're my stand in."

"'Oh, uhmm, I'm David Cassidy,' he told me . . . as if I didn't know!

"From then on, we were pretty good friends, on the set and off. David never once pulled this 'I'm a star, you're nothing' business that some people do.

"I can remember hearing about one former star who used to hire his own stand-ins. and then punch them when ever he was upset!

"I've never seen anything that bad, but I have seen some pretty big names use their stand-ins as scapegoats. It can be pretty bad, too.

"But I can never remember a time when David didn't have a smile and a good word to say for everyone, myself included."

Well it's little things like that that make people confess that David is a truly nice guy (just in case you were in doubt!).

I don't know what more I can say, except that this court finds David Cassidy (as well as his friends) GUILTY of being a very nice guy!
