### JUDGEMENT

Again, if he does accept a role of this kind, he will also expose himself to a whole new range of critics. And the critics who sit in judgement on every new film that is made are a lot tougher than anything that David has faced before. If he fails to satisfy the critics that he has actually done a better job than an ordinary actor then he would be in trouble.

He also must be receiving the usual pile of new—or old—songs every week. American publishers know that

Cassidy fans all over the world are waiting for the next record. Every single one of them would love to persuade David to sing their song. And they'll never stop trying while his records sell like they have done over recent years.

But David has no intention of taking any new step until he's certain in his own mind that he's doing the right thing.

I only hope that David doesn't wait too long to make up his mind. I believe it's important that he declares himself by the middle of this year.

If he doesn't then he will risk losing many loyal and faithful fans. They are prepared to wait very patiently for quite a long time—but not forever!
