David's decision also means that he MUST do more television and live appearances again very soon. No artist can sign an important recording contract without also agreeing to perform the songs that he records, either on television or on stage.

Our Hollywood reporter is very busy right now, chasing David for more of those short-haired photographs that you like so much. But David has been a bit camera-shy recently so we have been through our files to choose those extra special photos that we haven't been able to include in previous issues.
