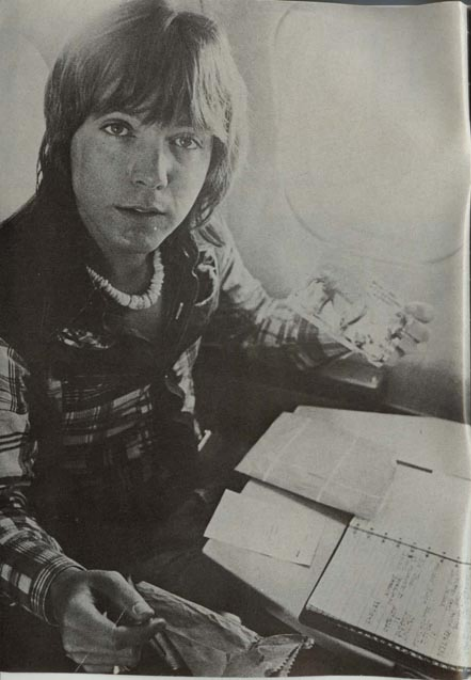

It must seem incredible that we didn't publish the title of David Cassidy's new single in the June issue of his magazine. But the reason was very simple—RCA got in touch with us—would you believe—at the beginning of June to tell us what the titles were going to be. Of course, we'd heard lots of songs mentioned before but one can't publish any information of this sort until it is definite.

As you know now, of course, the titles are 'I Write The Songs' which was written by Bruce Johnson of the Beach Boys, and 'Get It Up For Love'. Even when RCA rang me at the beginning of June, they said the release date was going to be 13th of last month, but, of course, it actually came out on the 20th because the master tape was late arriving in this country.

However, by the time you are reading this issue, every single David Cassidy fan will know about his new single because no dee-jay could possibly ignore the new offering from a superstar like David.

When—at long last—I heard 'I Write The Songs' I thought it was a perfect example of the new type of recording that David has been promising us. Incidentally, the 'B' side 'Get It Up For Love' was written by Ned Doheny.

And that's not all the important news either. David's new album is also due for release at the beginning of August. The title at the moment is very simply 'David Cassidy'. But if anyone changes their mind whilst the master tapes are being flown across the Atlantic, please don't blame me, because so many things seem to change these days between the first announcement and the final happening.

In this issue we have also got a fascinating feature from someone who shared some of David's problems when he was struggling so hard to become an actor in New York at the beginning of his career. It also reveals how much Ruth Aarons did to support David. Although, oddly enough, even she didn't realise how big he was going to become one day.

Of course, the most fantastic news was that David actually made it over here for a week at the end of last month to promote the new record, which was released on 20th June. Although he didn't manage any live shows, he did a number of TV spots and radio interviews, and it was great to hear him talking about all his plans for the future and about his forthcoming LP, due for release in August.

Now that he's going to be making regular releases, with a bit of luck, he'll be visiting this country very frequently from now on to back them up, and that means lots more chances of seeing David live, hearing him and learning all the latest news as it happens.
