

YOUR FAVOURITE CASSIDY SONGS

Listening to all my copies of David's albums last night — and thoroughly enjoying every one of them — I began to wonder which, of the hundreds of tracks he's recorded, would come out tops with his fans, if we ever held a vote on the matter. Looking back at all those letters you've written from time to time, I began to see that there's a pretty common feeling between you all about the songs you love best.

This was demonstrated even more clearly when we asked you in the magazine what you thought of the album that Bell records released a little while ago called "David's Greatest Hits".

Fortunately you were also constructive and told us what you would have put on the album if you had been given the choice. Although we know that lots of David's fans get together from time to time, we're printing a few lines from various letters so that you can see what the "fave raves" of some of your friends are.

Marie Pithie of Birmingham didn't want to change much at all. In fact she reckoned that the tracks were very representative of the material that David has produced over the years. This is what she had to

say:—

"I have the album, and I think that it is a fair choice as his first "Greatest Hits" album. I am glad that David's older songs are on the album, because there is plenty of time to release his more up-to-date music".

SIDE 2:— "I Am A Clown", "Rock Me Baby", "Some Kind Of Summer", "The Puppy Song", "If I Didn't Care", "Please Please Me".

She added the following comment to her choice of tracks:—

"I don't think that "I'll Meet You Halfway" or "Doesn't Somebody Want To Be Wanted" should have been on the LP because you could hardly call them David's biggest hits could you? Also, I think that they should have put in all of "I Am A Clown", and not missed the talking bit at the beginning".

DIFFERENT VIEW

Well, that's tellin' us isn't it? Celia Turner of Bourne-mouth had a slightly different point of view to make. She had this to say:—

"Surely there was no need for any Partridge Family track on this album, not even "I Think I Love You". Also, I would have included "Puppy Song" and "Some Kind Of Summer", as well

as "Frozen Noses". I feel that this superb song should be included as an example of David's many talents, as writer and producer".

Pauline Hughes of Reading sent us her favourite Cassidy tracks too. She also would have liked an album containing "Some Kind Of Summer", but she would also have liked to hear "Could It Be Forever", "Cherish", "How Can I Be Sure", "Puppy Song", "Daydreamer", "If I Didn't Care", "Frozen Noses", and "Friend And Lover" as well.

IDEA

I hope that that's given you some sort of idea about the tracks which other David fans like best. All in all, there appear to be three or four which EVERYONE loves and the other most popular ones are scattered around the vast selection of numbers which David has recorded. By now, of course, we have eleven more to choose from because David's most recent contribution to the music scene, "The Higher They Climb, The Harder They Fall" is at the front of all our record collections I'm sure. Not only that! There's some underground rumbling about another album in the not too distant future. I wonder if there'll be any changes in our Cassidy Top Tens when that is finally released. I've got a hunch that there will be!
