CASSIDY COUNTDOWN

A day-by-day bulletin of David's working schedule during his visit to Britain last month

TUESDAY 5th SEPT: Arrive Heathrow at 21.35 on flight TWA 702.

Straight to the yacht, "Ocean Sabre", moored in the River Thames a short distance west of Tower Pier.

Informal drinks.

WEDNESDAY 6th: An early start to the day with an interview on the David Hamilton Show (BBC Radio 1).

Back to "Ocean Sabre" for Press interviews, photo call and a lunch-time Press reception.

Afternoon: "Today" interview with Alan Hargreaves, filmed on board the yacht, followed by more Press interviews.

Evening: 19.00. Top Of The Pops. David, geared out in cerise suit with satin finish, talks to Tony Blackburn in the show's "top of the bill" slot.

THURSDAY 7th: Most of day spent filming for the BBC in the grounds of a large private house in Stanmore, Middlesex. (Watch out for David on film in future Top Of The Pops programme!)

Evening: 18.30. Reception given in David's honour on board the "Ocean Sabre".

FRIDAY 8th: Fairflight Charter Special Heron Flight.

Checked in Heathrow Airport, Terminal 2, BEA Ground Floor Desk, at 08.00.

Departure 08.30. Breakfast served in flight, plus a general handout of David Cassidy goodies, such as special badges, pens, etc.

09.50. Arrival Amsterdam (Agent: Aero Ground Services). Party met by Harry Knipschild and Wiebe Andringa, of Polydor Nederland. Transport by car to television location within airport vicinity.

13.30. Check in Schiphol Airport.

14.00. Departure. Lunch served in flight.

15.40. Arrive Frankfurt (Agent: LTU).

Transport by waiting cars to nearby Airport Hotel.

16.00. Press interviews with a selected short list of German journalists. Also present were Ingo Stein, of Polydor International, and Ray Schmidt-Walk, of Deutsche Grammophon.

18.45. Check in Frankfurt Rhein-Main Flughafen.

19.45. Departure. Dinner served in flight (main dish - goulash).

21.35. Arrive Heathrow Airport. Transport by special cars into London.

SATURDAY 9th: Back to the Beeb (after another early morning call) for interviews with Ed Stewart on Junior Choice. Then more interviews (including some for Radio Luxembourg), with David managing to squeeze an occasional moment's sight-seeing in between!

SUNDAY 10th: It's only "Au revoir" till the Spring as David boards TWA 13.00 hrs. flight back home to the Partridge Family.
