TV's crooning clan inspired the extensive series of tie-ins by Curtis, which "kept Curtis Books alive" per Editor-in-Chief Patrick O'Connor. With 17 original mysteries, two David Cassidy bios, and the scarce Partridge Family Cookbook. Spearheaded by James A. Bryans, Editor-in-Chief at parent company Popular Library, Michael Avallone was signed to write the first three books. He wrote eight in all ("after the third book a difficult editor forced me to hide behind the Vance Stanton byline") and made out well ("... fortunately I had a royalty slice on Partridge and made a great deal of money when #2 sold 2-1/2 million copies in six months of 1971"). The Haunted Hall may indeed be the most common TV tie-in ever published. Picturing Susan Dey on the cover, it involves a family trip to a haunted mansion that Laurie Partridge remarks "looks like Collins House on Dark Shadows." Numbers 5 and 10 in the series are also quite common; with her royalties from those books author Vic Crume retired.

The show--and simultaneous debut of the group's real-life hit single "I Think I Love You"--skyrocketed David Cassidy to teen-idol fame, and he alone is pictured on 14 of the books in the Curtis series (and all of them from the ninth one on).
