still don't think they look tremendously alike, but it somehow seems possible they are a "family." I guess the fact is that working together and trying to appear as a family on the show has brought everyone closer, and that, in a sense, makes a much better family group than all the sets of identical twins and triplets or matching motherdaughter combinations ever could!

But all the cast members have lives outside their television roles, and it is this side of them I have had some chance to see and you haven't. I don't have any great and dark secrets to give away about any of the Partridges. I'm just going to tell you how I have seen them act when they aren't playing their Partridge roles.

SUZANNE IS KIND

Starting with the youngest, Suzanne. To be honest, I don't know Suzanne that well—only as much as any adult stranger might be friends with a little girl still interested in toys, animals,

way. In other words, he likes to experiment, testing what he should do to become a better actor. I like Jeremy because he really wants to learn and he has the power to go on learning as he grows older. After all, he is still very young.

Next in line is Danny. He and his family have often invited Susan and me to their house for supper or parties, and every time we accept, we become more like part of the Bonaduce family. I haven't any brothers, and so to have Danny become like a brother to me is a wonderful feeling. And like a sister, I can say that Danny is sometimes noisy and wild but he is also a typical kid, and that is how kids act.

I think there is another side to Danny that will come out more in a few years—Danny is very sensitive to other peoples' feelings and is always aware of their reactions to him. In my opinion, this quality is the very big advantage an actor ought to have, and

playing on the swing set, riding a bike, and so forth. I have been busy with writing, reading, and other dull (to a little girl, I suppose) activities, and so most of my talking with Suzanne has been about everyday things. But I can see that Suzanne is and will be a kind and generous girl. She is also very funny, playing tricks and making jokes. In fact, I've never seen her upset at anything, never crying, never complaining. Suzanne would be, if I were younger and she a little older, a good friend to have.

Jeremy is a very intelligent boy, interested in reading, in nature, and, naturally, in his progress on the drums. I suppose my memories of him will be his huge blue eyes and his constant energy; he is always asking questions about his acting and always wondering if he couldn't play his part in another

Danny has it. He will be a very good actor, better than he is now, and that means Danny will be very, very good.

KIND AND HONEST PEOPLE

As for the adults on the Partridge Family show-I know that both Shirley Jones and Dave Madden are very kind and honest people. Whenever I have spoken with either of them, they have been considerate enough to carry on a real conversation and not simply give back the stock answers other stars might have been content with. Shirley is, I know, very much taken up with her role in the show, but most often she can be found talking about her three sons and her husband, about current events, and about her own working and singing. She is a beautiful woman, not only physically but also
