You are perched right on the edge of your seat—David's director's chair—and your eyes, which are glued right on David Cassidy, are almost popping out of your head. I can tell just by the way you're sitting that you are full of excitement and joy. And suddenly I am transported into your world—the happy, wonderful world of spending the next hour watching David Cassidy at work on a segment of The Partridge Family series. Now you are really going to see how David really does it—and that's a thrill you're never going to forget!!
