While studying the endings of David's words I was especially fascinated by his d's! Notice how David curves the final stroke around the word he's just written?

People who do this are usually protective and are on the lookout to guard themselves and others from danger. Writing like this also denotes sensitivity, and if the curve is ever hooked (as David's sometimes is) it reveals inclinations towards a sense of humor.

Many people find it difficult to maintain a straight line while writing, but did you know that sometimes it's beyond control? Moods can dictate the course of writing, and often times a person who is cheerful and happy will write uphill. Downhill slopes can be characteristic of depression.
