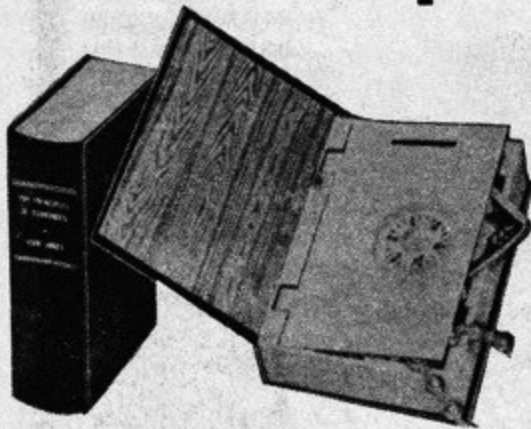

"Finally (it wasn't really all that long, I suppose about three or four months, but it seemed like a terribly long time to me) I got a part in a Broadway show called 'The Fig Leaves Are Falling.' I was eighteen.

"It was a good role. I played Barry Nelson and Dorothy Loudon's son. It was a musical comedy and it flopped."

From there he was spotted for a screen test at Universal, which in turn led to David's first TV show as a thief on an episode of "Ironside."

David thinks that he wasn't too good in that first show but he was good enough because it led to a great deal of work for him during that year, including shots on such shows as: "Marcus Welby," "Mod Squad," "Bonanza," "Medical Center," and "The FBI."

With this impressive list of credits behind him, David landed a regular part on "The Partridge Family" and he is now well on his way to stardom.
