It was finally a tie, because we both ended up black! Another time we tried to see whose hair could grow the longest. I really tried, but mine stopped after a while, so Dave won that one!

Dave was a good sport about being teased, too. He never minded being called Hoppy, and the other thing I remember is his beard—I mean his lack of one! Most of the other guys had to shave every day, but not Dave. So every time they saw him they'd say, "Are you shaving yet?" He'd just laugh. He never got uptight about it.

We never used to trade clothes or anything because I'm a larger size, but now that I think of it, I borrowed a pair of his shoes once, probably four years ago! I still have them! I always felt as if he were my brother, and anything I had, I shared with him. And Dave was the same way.

DAVE ALWAYS LOVED ACTING

If there was one main difference between us in those days, it would be that Dave gave more thought to his future than I did. Everything we did was living day by day, but once in awhile Dave would have a serious moment, and he'd talk about what he wanted to do. There was never any doubt in his mind that he was going to be an actor!

We used to joke about it. I'd say, "Okay Dave, when you're an actor and you've made it, I'll be your chauffeur!' He called me Levy then, and he'd answer, "Sure, Levy! I'll keep that in mind!" But all kidding aside, I always knew that acting was the one thing that meant more to Dave than anything else, because it was always in the back of his mind.


SAL MINEO'S DRUMS
