Dear FLIP,

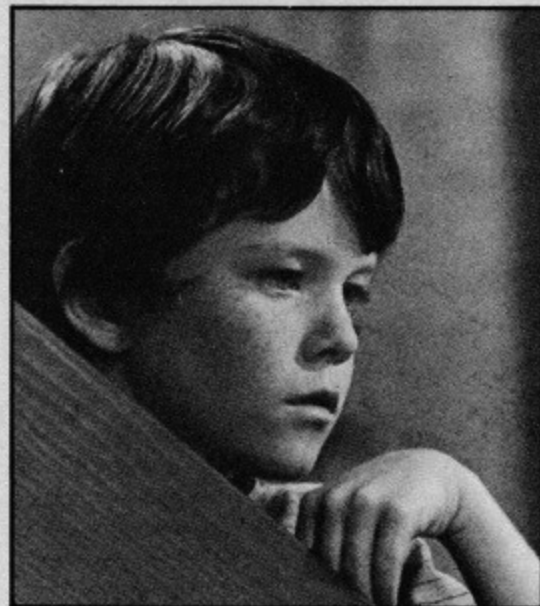
