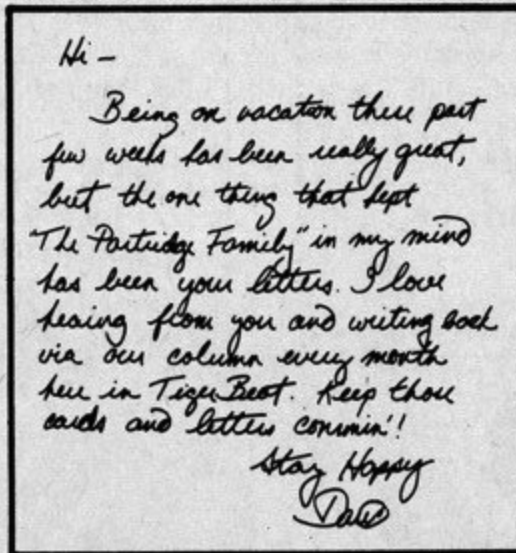
Dear Susan,
