The girl David Cassidy loves is far from perfect. She's not too tall and she's not too short; she's not too fat and she's not too thin. Actually, she's not *too* anything. But David Bruce Cassidy would—for the girl David loves is not a "stand-out" type in the popular sense of the expression at all. The very thing that catches David's attention and makes him keep looking at her is the fact that she isn't flashy, loud or pushy—the fact that she's just a "typical girl".

As David himself puts it, "When I think about a girl I love, I don't see a picture of any particular girl. What I mean is I don't have this vision of her and how she's going to look. But, in a sense, I *do* see her. I can't tell you what color her hair or eyes are, but I do know that her hair is—well, *right* for her. It's clean and it's combed in a simple manner that becomes her face. I can't tell you whether it's curly or straight, but I *know*—and I pick hair because it's sort of like starting at the top and going down—her 'crowning glory' indicates a lot about the way she thinks about herself and cares about herself."

What David is trying to say is—he is inevitably attracted to a girl who tries to look as attractive as she can. "A lot of girls sort of don't seem to bother—or they think it's hip to look kind of you know, dirty or sloppy. But I *don't* like that hippie look and I *don't* like an overly made-up or too plastic look. So, like I said, the way a girl cares for her hair is like a tip-off to her whole attitude—not only about herself but about other people."

Next, David notices a girl's face. He realizes that some girls are painfully shy about being stared at, so he is careful not to stare. When he looks at a girl, it's not to criticize or find fault or pinpoint the areas where she falls short of being pretty.

"When I look at a girl's face, it's like I'm looking at the story of her personality—the way she moves her eyes, the way she tilts her head and the way she smiles. All these things tell me a great deal about what she's like. As he has made clear, an interesting girl to David is a girl who is "at home" being herself.
