get that same old feeling inside. Bu it's broken in a little bit. And, you know, now it seems like the greatest feeling in the world."

3. David sang himself to sleep at night when he was younger!

He saw his father, Jack Cassidy, performing on stage for the first time and wanted to be just like him. So throughout his school days, he sang his way around the house trying to imitate his dad.
