If you saw the very first Partridge show, you may have noticed one scene, where Jeremy was upset about a little girl who had the drum solo. She was the very girl who just might have been Christine Partridge!

Did you see the episode were Keith was being chased by all the girls in his school? One of the girls was in the Partridge house all the time, just watching Keith, because she was madly in love with him. Remember? That girl was almost Laurie Partridge!!!!

Shirley Jones had some concern about the auditions too. Even though she was already signed for the starring role in the series, and had no personal worries about the series beyond doing a good job, she found herself surrounded by two groups of very talented people.

One of them, **David**, was her own stepson, and no one could object if she was secretly rooting in her heart for **David**, but as for the others . . . she knew the inevitable truth . . . one would win, and the other would have to lose.

VERY HARD WORK

But winning the part didn't end everyone's worries...it just set off a chain of new ones! First, the pilot had to be filmed and that took two weeks of extremely hard work. All the stars knew from the very start that this show had to be the best thing they'd ever done, because everyone wanted the pilot to sell!
