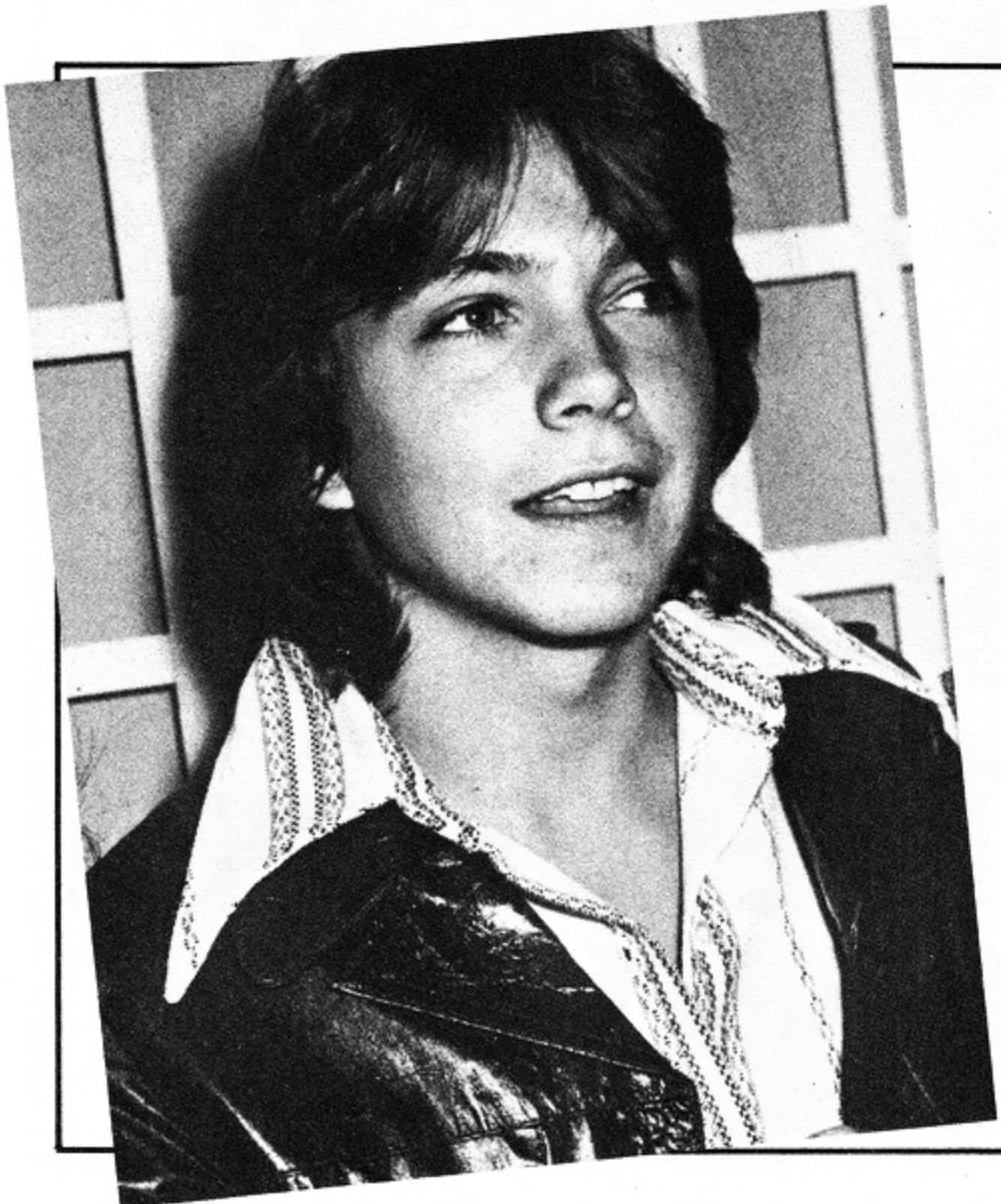


# David Cassidy Cries Out For **TEENAGE RIGHTS:**
