
## WHO'S WHO SALUTES



WITH ONE not-so-successful Broadway show and a handful of TV guest appearances to his credit, David Cassidy mushroomed to almost overnight success as Keith Partridge in ABC-TV's "The Partridge Family." Eventually he landed a role in the Broadway musical "The Fig Leaves Are Falling." The play didn't last too long and when it closed, David returned to Hollywood.

Deciding to take a stab at college, David enrolled at Los Angeles City College, planning to major in psychology. Meanwhile, he continued to practice playing piano, guitar and drums while waiting for his big break. In time, he landed a number of roles in TV shows like "Ironside," "Marcus Welby, M.D.," "The F.B.I.," "Adam-12," "Bonanza," "Medical Center," "The Mod Squad" and "The Survivors."
