The way to a beautiful complexion starts with a clean face! And I do mean a scrubbed clean face! You should wash your face 3 times a day, at least. There's no such thing as washing it too many times!

There are many products on the market for washing your face, but all you need is soap, water and a clean face cloth or brush! You actually don't need anything else and there's no real difference in the soaps on the market today.

I try to teach the children here on the set the importance of keeping their hands clean. You'd be surprised the number of times you touch your face during the day! It's not really such a big chore, but it's an important one, especially here on the set!

DUSTY PLACE

On a typical set, there isn't a second when you're not in a "contaminated" area! A set is a dusty situation—the air, the props, the stage itself. It's impossible to keep things sparkling clean—it would be an
