to pose with her. He says he never saw her before that incident, nor after.

Patricia claims they indeed saw one another privately, had sexual intercourse and that as a result she became pregnant. She is asking for medical and hospital expenses for the baby's birth, plus any subsequent medical expenses for him, attorneys fees and \$1,000 per month child support.

Blood tests, ordered taken last year, proved inconclusive to the court's satisfaction and Patricia's attorney has requested that both parties submit to polygraph (lie detector) tests. If the tests were given, they have not as yet appeared as evidence in court.

The battle could conceivably drag on for another year. In the meantime, Patricia and her son share a small inexpensive apartment in North Hollywood—one that she can afford on her salary as a waitress since she gets no 'temporary support' from Elvis.

Little Jason, a chubby, quiet baby, spends his days in a nursery school while his mother works. The name of the school, as well as their home address and Patricia's place of employment have been kept secret from the public due to the passion of Elvis' loyal fans.

He has inspired this kind of loyalty almost from the beginning of his career. Many of these fans are not starry-eyed young girls but middle-aged matrons who are decent, church-going women. Their feeling (often maternal) for Elvis is so strong however, that any accusation against his character triggers irrational reaction and they 'flip out.'
