STAR: "Some people say you are changing your music style and that you are trying to appeal to an older audience. Is that true?"

DAVID: "You know, that's a hard question to answer. I truly want to appeal to all the fans who have been with me since I started making records. But every singer wants to attract a larger audience as he grows. I know that my fans are older than they were when I first started singing—some are 16, 17, even 18 years old! So I think I should try to appeal to both the young teenagers, who like *Partridge Family*, and the older girls, too!"

STAR: "What kind of music do you like to sing?"

DAVID: "Good music! I like to sing everything! I go through different moods where I'll like to sing old blues songs, or old forties songs like Cheek To Cheek. But then I get really turned on by some of the songs BREAD does. I really love Baby I'm A Want You."

STAR: "What would you do if your acting and singing career were over?"

DAVID: "I don't think that my acting and singing career will ever be over. The 'success' might be over someday, but my career won't be 'cause it's my life and my first love!"

STAR: "What would you like doing most in the future?"

DAVID: "I really feel I was blessed by the wonderful success of the Partridge Family. In the future, when I move into motion picture roles, I want to do things that I feel are creative. I don't want to do one thing over another just because it means more money. I feel that when an actor is financially secure, he has more time to be creative and pick roles he really wants to do"

STAR: The New York Daily News newspaper says you're self centered. Are you?"

DAVID: "To tell you the truth, I didn't read that article they wrote about me, but I heard about it! Maybe I am. I don't know. I suppose everyone cares about themselves. The writer of that article probably felt that I was too preoccupied with working and making records, and I guess I am in a way!"

STAR: "Some people think you want to appeal to older college kids, rather than to high school and junior high girls. Is this true?"

DAVID: "I don't care one way or the other about college kids. I don't think of things that way. If someone in college can't open up and enjoy them-
