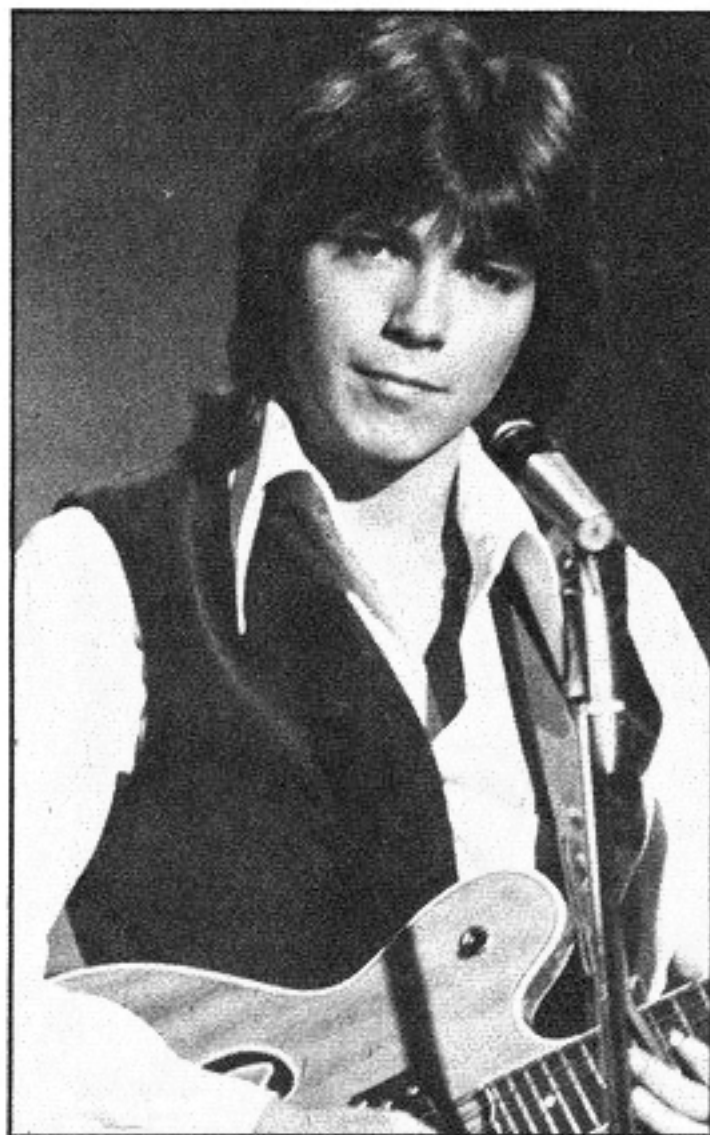
Brian Forster says that just being part of the Partridge Family is the best memory of all.
