a neighborhood movie and get a hamburger afterwards."

David doesn't get away often since he has a large entourage and many responsibilities. But when he does, he's a changed and happy young man, better able to face the full schedule his managers commit him to. As one close friend of David's put it, "His life changed so rapidly he still isn't used to it. One minute he was a kid in New York trying to become an actor, the next minute he was a superstar. It has been a hard transition for him since he really never prepared himself for success. I remember once, when he first was cutting an album, an engineer went over to him and started advising him how to sing the song they were working on. David listened and changed his style, only to bring the producer out of the booth screaming, 'What happened to your voice?' When David explained he was doing what the engineer told him the producer looked him right in the eye and said, 'You better learn who to listen to and who not to if you have any idea of being a success.' It was a big lesson for David and he changed. He's been on the road to success ever since."

It's a lonely road and David is not the kind of man that enjoys the almost constant surveillance that fame brings, so he

must find his relaxation when and where he can. If it means sneaking away from his hotel in the night to meet a girl on a private date, David knows he has no choice. In fact, in many ways he realizes that the mystery he brings to a simple date is something few men are capable of. What must have been on his mind as the cab sped through midtown New York towards an old high school friend now going to college? He might have remembered her as a girl that he always liked, and wondered how time had changed her, but more than likely he was concerned about whether he really was free for an evening, or whether he would be recognized.

It turned out that David had little to worry about, since in the campus area where he and his date met he seemed to melt in with the many other people his age. Like many famous people, David would like to be judged for what he is, not what his image says he is. It's a real problem.

There are many stories of David's exploits in getting away so he could go on a date. But the most typical occurred recently, when he changed cars with a friend in the middle of the highway and sped away, not realizing that he left the house with no money, driver's license, or identification. His date had to pay for dinner, and she kidded him about it all evening. He said, "She kept on teasing me about having no money, but it made me feel good since the idea of being broke is so remote to me. I learned about myself and how dependent I am on things that I take for granted, like money. I only get \$150 a week spending money, but I'm used to it." David is also used to having someone there to take care of expenses like checks and tips, and getting out on his own teaches him what it is to be just another young man on a date. It is something he truly enjoys.

A close friend of David's said, "I've noticed a real change in him recently. It is almost like he is starting to come back down to earth after his meteoric rise to fame. For a long time David acted like he was sitting on a keg of dynamite and if he moved it would explode. He didn't believe in his success and he was afraid to make a mistake.
