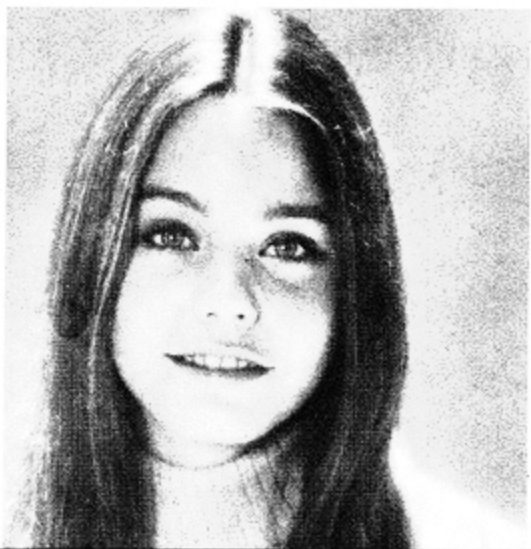
CLASS of '73
