

This one took us all by surprise when it was rush released in the States a few weeks back. Still, the timing was good because it just gave the album time to make its mark in the charts for Christmas!

It could well be a repeat performance for Easter here in Britain, because the scheduled release date for the U.K. is 2nd March. And that's not so far away now, after all. Just think what a groovy appetiser it'll make for David's visit a little later in the month!! In fact, it's quite likely that he'll sing a couple of tracks from the album in his live concerts. But, right now, NOBODY knows exactly what he's got planned for those gigs, and, if I know David, he'll do his best to keep at least some of the programme as a surprise.
