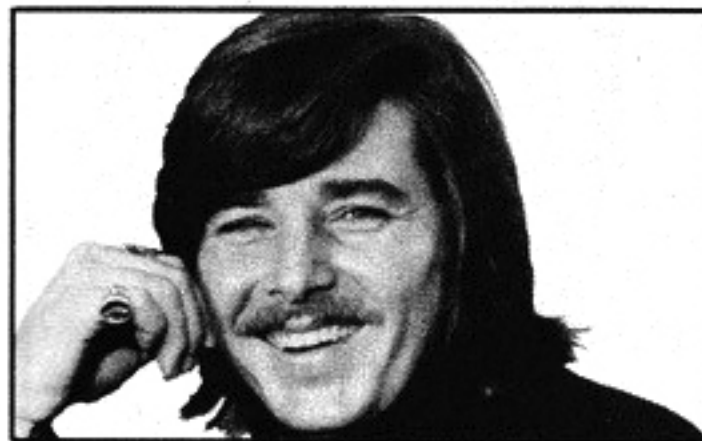
TONY DeFRANCO:
