David Williams:



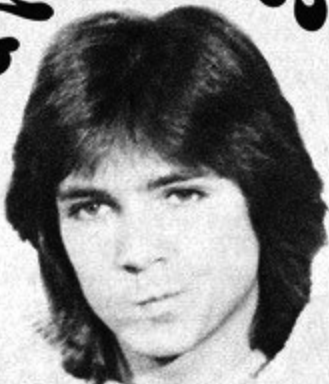
