

Q. I recently saw David Cassidy on "Medical Center." I would like to know if he is related to Zooey Hall who was in the canceled TV show "New People." — L. Houghton, Rochester.

A. Starring in the new ABC series "The Partridge Family", David plays the oldest son of Shirley Partridge, who is played by his real-life step-mother, Shirley Jones.

Born in New York City, David is the son of Jack Cassidy. David has three step brothers (Shawn, Patrick and Ryan) by his father's marriage to Miss Jones. Thusly, he is not related to Zooey Hall.

Singing since he was three, David plays the electric guitar and drums. He has recorded two albums that will be released in connection with the series.

His favorite sports are tennis and riding, and he hopes, someday, to have his own recording studio and go into filmmaking.
