

David Cassidy Sings 'Point Me'

For the first time in his life Sunday, David Cassidy will sing "Point Me in the Direction of Albuquerque" in Albuquerque.

The young singer will appear at 8 p.m. Sunday in Tingley Coliseum — in one of his regular "weekend tours."

"Actually I've been dying to

sing that song in Albuquerque," said Cassidy in a telephone interview. "It was on one of my albums and it did quite well there, I hear."

CASSIDY WORKS all week long on "The Partridge Family" television series, then takes off Friday night for a weekend tour of two cities.

This weekend he will sing here and in Amarillo, Tex.

"Many of the songs I will sing will be the same as the Partridge Family songs," he said. "But they will have a different background — a different backup band. Others will be my new single, "Cherish," and songs from an

album I will be doing on my own."

Cassidy, a single man seems to do little but work. He records at night, works on the series during the day and tours weekends.

"I DO VERY MUCH ENJOY live audiences," he said. "There's more of a rapport. It's more stimulating to have people there reacting — there's a give and take. Of course doing film work is also good, because if you don't do it

well the first time, you can go back and do it again."

Cassidy played feature roles in such television shows as "Marcus Welby," "Ironside," and "Bonanza" before the start of the Partridge Family series last year.

The 21-year-old actor-singer says he wants to continue to do both.

"I'd like to do something different as an actor, maybe do a good film," he said. "But I'm always going to be singing."
