



David Cassidy Slated At Tulsa Fair

Popular young recording and television star David Cassidy has been added to the growing list of top-name personalities scheduled to appear during the 1972 Tulsa State Fair, Sept. 29 through Oct. 8.

Cassidy, who is the lead voice on the Partridge Family's records and plays the role of Keith Partridge in the smash weekly television series, will present two shows on the second Saturday of the Fair.

Fair director John Elsner termed the booking of Cassidy for this year's Heritage Days celebration "another effort by the fair to provide entertainment for all ages". Cassidy has rapidly become a super-teen-idol in a proportion equaled by few.

From the first Partridge Family single "I Think I Love You" through the many follow-up hits, Cassidy has been an essential part of the sound that made every release a multi-million seller.

Cassidy's two appearances

are scheduled for 5:30 and 8 p.m. in the Fairgrounds Pavilion on Oct. 7. Other top entertainers previously announced for this year's fair include country and western singing star Charley Pride, the Lettermen and recording artist B. J. Thomas.
