nearby Empire Pool.

Earlier in the series, parents claimed that their daughters had been hosed down by security men try-ing to keep crowds from the American star.

Yesterday Cassidy was chased by hundreds of young girls, some of them only twelve, as he was driven back to the hotel.

They packed the hotel

forecourt. chanting: "We want David!"

Extra security men were called in as the crowd tried to rush the locked plate-glass doors.

Inside the hotel, staff held the doors in case the crowd managed to break their way in.

Police fought their way through the crowd to pluck out some girls in danger of being crushed against the

doors.
At the height of the battle the girls smashed an C80 plate-glass window at the rear of the hotel in an attempt to reach their idol.
It was only when the

weenyboppers' hysteria reached fever point that the two dogs were brought in.

Some girls were visibly shocked—and scared—as the dogs moved forward.

Hotel manager Brian Holt said: "I've never seen anything like this.

"We got the dogs from a security firm. I don't think they would hurt anyone."
